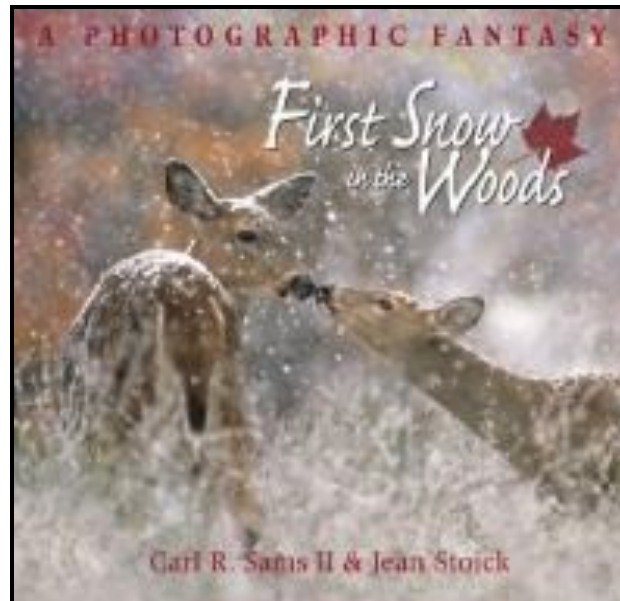


Grandmother Winter

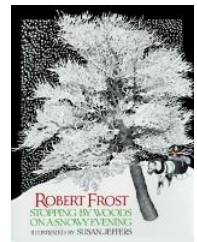
