### *Mable Riley: A Reliable Record of Humdrum, Peril, and Romance* (J Jocelyn)

In 1901, fourteen-year-old Mable Riley dreams of being a writer and having adventures. She secretly becomes friends with a neighbor who holds scandalous opinions on women's rights.

### *Uncommon Faith* (J Krishner)

In 1837-38, residents of Millbrook, Massachusetts, speak in their different voices on major issues of their day, including women's rights, slavery, religious differences, and one fiery girl named Faith.

### *A Time for Courage: The Suffragette Diary of Kathleen Bowen* (J Lasky)

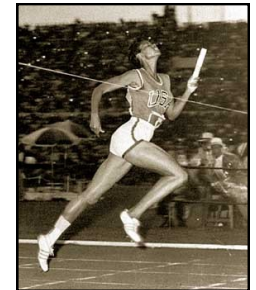
