

Dual Degrees



To meet the challenges of an evolving workplace and workforce, the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill School of Information and Library Science (SILS) has partnered with several other UNC-Chapel Hill schools as well as North Carolina State University in Raleigh, N.C., to offer students the opportunity to pursue two degrees simultaneously. Many find that this approach affords the knowledge, skills and integrated perspective needed to manage information assets and best serve their organization's or the public's information needs.

The goal of the dual degrees, which can be completed in three academic years, is to maximize learning, minimize course and content overlap, and provide students with a means to efficiently earn two synergistic degrees.

Dual Degrees Offered

The following degrees are combined with either the Master of Science in Information Science (MSIS) or the Master of Science in Library Science (MSLS):

- MSLS/MA and MSIS/MA (Cooperative Archival Program with North Carolina State Department of Public History - Master's in Public History)
- MSLS/MAH and MSIS/MAH (UNC-CH Department of Art – Master's in Art History)
- MSIS/MBA (UNC-CH Kenan-Flagler Business School - Master's in Business Administration)
- MSIS/MPA and MSLS/MPA (School of Government – Master's in Public Administration)
- MSIS/MHA and MSLS/MHA (UNC-CH Gillings School of Global Public Health - Master's in Health Policy and Administration)
- MSIS/JD and MSLS/JD (UNC-CH School of Law - Juris Doctorate)
- MSIS/MSN and MSLS/MSN (UNC-CH School of Nursing - Master's of Science in Nursing)
