

Financial Aid



More than 70 percent of the School of Information and Library Science graduate students receive merit-based financial aid through SILS assistantships, fellowships, scholarships or grants. Prospective graduate students should apply by the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill Graduate School admissions deadlines (gradschool.unc.edu/admissions/deadlines.html) to receive full consideration for financial aid.

Need-Based Aid

Need-based assistance is handled by the UNC Office of Scholarships and Student Aid (OSSA). Application is made by completing the FAFSA form and requesting that financial information be sent to University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. For questions regarding need-based aid, please consult OSSA directly.

Merit-Based Aid

There is no separate application process for merit-based financial aid; awards are based on the information provided by the applicant during the admissions process. Many SILS awards are of one-year duration; others are renewed for a second year, contingent upon academic and service performance. Entering and second-year students have a number of opportunities to apply for part-time internships offered by area corporations, information agencies, or libraries. Students must apply directly to the individual departments or organizations for these positions.
